POD@RCIS is a Dutch periodical published in English devoted to terrarium keeping and herpetology. This publication appears only as webzine (http://www.podarcis.nl). Authors receive the pdf-file of their contribution. They are at liberty to distribute these on a non-profit basis among interested individuals. Reproduction of articles, or parts thereof, published in POD@RCIS is otherwise only allowed with the written consent of the chief editor. Articles considered for publication concern reptiles, amphibians and terrarium techniques. There is a preference for articles on reproduction, behaviour and ecology. We also welcome student reports on herpetological subjects. New names and nomenclatural acts within this publication are intended to serve as a permanent, public scientific record as laid out in the International Code of Zoological Nomenclature. Identical copies on cd/dvd have been deposited in the libraries of the National library of the Netherlands, Naturalis (Netherlands), Natural History Museum (Great Britain), Zoologisches Museum und Forschungsinstitut A. Koenig (Germany), Museum national d'histoire naturelle - Laboratoire Reptiles et Amphibiens (France), Zoological Institute Russian Academy of Sciences St. Petersburg (Russia), National Museum of Natural History (USA), Peabody Museum of Natural History (USA), Royal Ontario Museum (Canada), Hebrew University of Jerusalem (Israel), Razi University Kermanshah (Iran), Raffles Museum of Biodiversity Research (Singapore), Bayworld (South Africa), and Museu de Zoologie São Paulo (Brazil). POD@RCIS is published by the foundation 'Podarcis', dedicated to the publication and distribution of herpetological information (Chamber of Commerce Rotterdam registration 24303166). POD@RCIS is indexed in Zoological Record.

Instructions for authors

Send manuscripts in electronic form to the chief editor. Do not include illustrations in the text. These should be submitted separately. Please note that we accept manuscripts offered in Dutch and English, and potentially in other modern languages (contact the chief editor beforehand). Starting with volume 6 (2005) we publish in English only (additonal summaries in other languages are acceptable). The manuscript must not have been published in any form or cannot be submitted simultaneously for publication elsewhere.

For information on style, please consult recent editions of POD@RCIS. The title should include the scientific name and may include the common name of the species. The name and address of the author(s) and a short introduction should follow the title. The rest of the text should be divided into sections, each with its own short heading. Do not use footnotes. Follow the article with a summary and list of referenced articles. This list should be in alphabetical order by the last name of the first author and should cover all articles referred to in the text. The citations should be in the style of the following examples for articles, books, and collective works:

Use capital letters for the substantives, geographical, and proper nouns in the abbreviation (e.g. Biol. J. Linn. Soc. Lond., J. zool. Syst. evol. Res.). Cite authors in-text in small caps with a maximum of two authors and use 'et al.' non-italicized when there are more than two authors, e.g. Mertens & Wermuth (1960), Frost et al. (2006). For species names, the scientific name is italicized and the author name is written in normal typeface, e.g. *Algyroides fitzingeri* (Wiegmann, 1834). Personal communications are written in normal typeface, preferably with date, e.g. (pers. comm. R. Günther, Sept. 2007).

Suitable illustrative material includes good quality slides, black and white or colour photographs or line drawings. The maximum hard copy size for drawings and photographs is A4; we prefer electronic files. The illustrations should be individually numbered and a short title or description of the illustrations should be provided. Slides will be automatically returned to the author after use. All other illustrative material will only be returned on request.

Accepted digital formats

Slides in JPEG but preferably in TIFF; drawings in BMP (0-1) or GIF (1:1 100 dpi, max. 300 dpi). Texts: Word or OpenOffice. Please contact the chief editor before mailing larger (in total >5 MB) manuscripts.
